# In memory of Maria Weber for her pioneering contribution in Italy to a better understanding of the Chinese economy.

Maria Weber was a Professor of International Relations and Comparative Politics at Bocconi University and responsible for research on Asia at the Institute of International Political Studies (IIPS). She held many other important positions.

From 2004 to 2006 she was the Managing Director of the Italian Institute of Culture in Beijing.

In her studies on China she was ahead of her time. Never so more in her analysis of the strategies employed by firms in approaching the Chinese market.

When for Italian entrepreneurs China was still an unknown and distant marketplace, Maria Weber went to great lengths to highlight the immense opportunities it offered.

She published several articles and books among which: "Vele verso la Cina" (Olivares ed., Milano, 1996); "Il miracolo cinese" (Il Mulino, eds, Bologna, 2002 and 2003); "Il Dragone e l'Aquila. Cina e USA: la vera sfida" (Bocconi University ed., Milano, 2005); "Due anni di Cina, opportunità di business e scenari in evoluzione" (Etas, Milano, 2008).

Maria Weber was much loved by her students and highly respected by her academic colleagues. On March 18, 2009 she passed away, at the young age of 58.
